

### **AIRMAN/AME INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORIZATION FOR SPECIAL ISSUANCE**

For continued Certification under this Authorization:

1. A physical examination (FAA Form 8500-8) by a designated AME will be required at the frequency prescribed under the provisions of 14 CFR, § 61.23. Your next Third-Class application will be due in **August 2026**.

2. In **August 2023**, you are required to obtain the following:

- A current detailed clinical progress note from your treating physician regarding your history of Pituitary Macroadenoma. The report should address history and symptoms, diagnosis, treatment plan, current over-the-counter and prescription medications (name, dosage, indication, frequency of use and side effects) and prognosis. Include the results of any current testing deemed appropriate.
- A current Eye evaluation from your treating Eye Specialist in accordance with the enclosed specification. FAA Form 8500-14 should be completed by your Eye Physician in its entirety and legibly.
- Current reliable Visual Field Graphs (Humphrey, 24-2 SITA Standard). Please submit graphs with narrative interpretation from your Eye care specialist.
- A current Optical Coherence Tomography (OCT), if deemed necessary by your physician to document stability.

You meet the Conditions AMEs Can Issue (CACI) program criteria for **Hypertension**; your condition(s) will be monitored by your AME under the CACI program. Prior to your August 2026 FAA medical examination, and **every 60 months thereafter**, you should follow these steps:

Consult your AME or the online CACI criteria at: [www.faa.gov/go/caci](http://www.faa.gov/go/caci) to identify the reports and/or testing required by the FAA.

Using the CACI worksheet as a reference, ask your treating Physician for a current status report that addresses the items on the worksheet and include any required testing.

Give the required documentation to your AME at the time of or prior to your FAA medical examination.

If you do NOT provide the required documentation to your AME, or if you are not otherwise qualified, the AME is instructed NOT to issue a Certificate. If you continue to meet CACI criteria, your AME will continue to follow this condition.

**To avoid a lapse in your Certification**, we recommend that you obtain the information listed above **60 DAYS PRIOR** to the expiration of your Airman Medical Certificate.
